

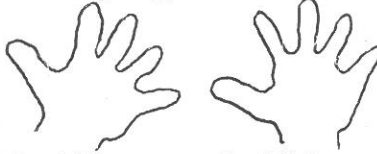
How to help your child learn multiplication and division facts

Counting pairs of socks (x2)

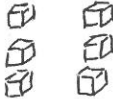


Counting fingers and thumbs (x5, x10)

Matching repeated addition to multiplication

$$2 + 2 = 2 \times 2 = 4$$

$$2 + 2 + 2 = 3 \times 2 = 6$$

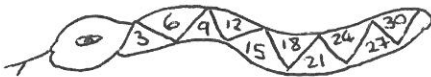
$$2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = 4 \times 2 = 8$$
